

Inserting Additional form fields to your Contact Form

The contactus.php file is configured to allow easy manipulation. By following these simple steps, you can ensure that any additional form fields you insert are included in the email that is submitted.

What Do You Need to Start?

- Contact Form Solution Pack
- WYSIWYG or Text Editor (such as Dreamweaver or Notepad)

Adding form fields

It is not uncommon to find that you want to add another couple form fields on your contact form. Form fields for 'phone number' and 'how did you hear about us?' are common additions.

1. Open the contactus.php page you wish to edit.
2. Insert any form field (list/menu, text, radio button).
3. Enter a name for the id of the form field.

Note: Id's must be a single word, or multiple words separated by an underscore (_).

4. Enter a name for the form field.

Note: In the email, the name will appear in bold, preceding the value that was entered.

The following sample code displays a custom text field that has been inserted to the contact form.

```
<label>  
<input type="text" name="Phone_Number" id="phone_number"  
>  
</label>
```

Note: In order to ensure that your additional fields display properly, make sure that they are inserted outside of any conditional statements. Your custom fields should be inserted after any code that looks like this:

```
<?php //WAFV_Conditional contact.php contact(4:)  
}
